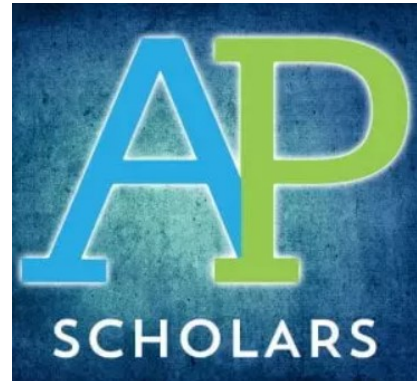

Special Schedule - Friday (8/16)

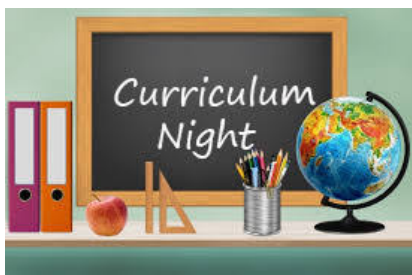

A Message from our Deans...Dress for Success

We hope you have had an amazing time with your family away from school. We are excited to begin the year on a positive note. As the year begins, we would like for you to remember the school's dress code policy. Please review the policy in your [student's handbook](#) and remind them of the policies and procedures that are in place.

A few key points taken directly from our handbook are listed below:

Students are expected to dress in a manner, which will not disrupt the educational process, constitute a health or safety hazard, or violate civil law. This policy may be amended due to current trends in fashion. Students in violation of the Dress Code policy may be addressed by the administration.

Consequences include changing clothes, confiscation of inappropriate apparel and further disciplinary measures as deemed appropriate.

Students should wear clothing that is age appropriate, neat, clean, and well fitting. Pants with holes, rips, or tears must comply with the Dress Code. Generally, clothing must extend from the top of the shoulders to the mid-thigh area (or longer), and undergarments shall not be visible. Shoulder straps on tops should be at least one-inch-wide; spaghetti straps shall not be visible. Specifically, bare backs, bare sides, bare midriffs, and cleavage are unacceptable. Tops must cover the pant, short, or skirt waistband.

Clothing will be prohibited that advertises, advocates, symbolizes, or displays drugs, alcohol, gangs, profanity, sexual innuendos or obscenity, violence, disruptive behavior, intimidation, or other criminal behavior. Examples of prohibited clothing include, but are not limited to: gang identifiers.

Be on Time...it's the cool thing to do!



Several years ago, Yorkville High School implemented a school wide tardy policy as a means to our continued desire to prepare students to be college, career, and life ready. As a result, we experienced a significant reduction of tardies. More importantly, we reduced the number of students earning at least one tardy that ultimately led to increased instructional time for our students which contributes greatly to our academic success in the classroom!

Please note that we will NOT count tardies until August 21st, so students can become accustomed to their class schedules.

Tardiness to Class – per semester (unexcused late arrival to school or to class). Students are considered on time to class when they have entered the classroom prior to the bell sounding. Tardiness (less than 5 minutes) to all classes have the following consequences:

- Tardies 1-5 are warning and contact home
- Tardies 6 + will receive progressive discipline as decided by the dean of students.
- Each time a student is tardy to class they should report to the nearest raptor desk.

What if I am Tardy to class greater than 5 minutes? - Students will be required to obtain a Tardy pass from the nearest raptor. Students more than five minutes late may receive more strict consequences beginning with the first offense.

Expectations of Students 5+ minutes late to first hour - Students will report to the main office. They will receive a raptor notice indicating the # of the tardy, and will be assigned a consequence immediately. Students arriving after the 1st hour has concluded will be sent immediately to the deans' office.

How will my student be given the expectations of this policy prior to the implementation on August 21st? Teachers will review the tardy expectation with students in their classes, including ACCESS classes during the first 3 days of school. An announcement about Tardies will be made during the daily announcements via the PA. The Dean's will also review the Tardy policy during all school meetings on August 15th.

Attendance Matters

Parents as a reminder attendance and connectedness is a top indicator for a student's success during their high school experience. Your child's Dean of Students is here to support your child in both of these areas. To that end it is important that there is an open line of communication with the school when your student will not be in attendance. Please see the following parameters for excused vs. unexcused absences.



Excused vs. Unexcused Absences - An unexcused absence is defined as an absence from school for a reason other than those listed as an excused absence and/or an absence not authorized by school personnel. If the main office has not received a phone call from the student's parent/guardian prior to 9 a.m. on the day of the absence, the student will be considered unexcused. Please call the main office for YHS at 630-553-4380; or YHSA at 630-553-4385. YHS considers the following reasons as examples of an unexcused absence. This list is not exhaustive. It includes but is not limited to:

1. Oversleeping
2. Car trouble
3. Missing the bus
4. Giving rides to the airport
5. Babysitting
6. Shopping
7. Traffic

8. Vacations (family or otherwise) - The district believes that students should take family trips during scheduled school breaks and should be in school when school is in session. The district actively discourages the practice of students being taken out of school for family trips as vacations are recorded as unexcused absences.

Following Up after an Unexcused Absence or Tardy - YHS deans will send home information regarding unexcused absences from class as well as tardiness to class. In the event that your child is unexcused or excessively tardy to school or class, consequences may occur. We expect that students arrive at class and school on time. Any tardiness or late arrivals beyond 5 minutes will generate a referral to the dean's office. Schedule Change Process

Schedule Changes:

Course Selection and Scheduling

- First three days (8-15 thru 8-19): If a student is requesting to drop a class, they need to consult with their parent, current teacher and counselor to complete a "Course Withdrawal Request Form." The student will pick up a "Course Withdrawal Request Form" from their counselor. Students consult with their current teacher and case manager when applicable as they make decisions in regard to their current class. *Please note that class sizes are reflective of our mandate of the 70/30 ratio for our special education students and class options are limited due to seat occupancies at capacity for most sections. The Course Withdrawal Form is located in the Guidance Office.
- After three days (8-20 thru 8-28): The student and teacher need to work collaboratively with their respective Division Chair to complete the "Course Withdrawal Request Form" that a student will pick up from their counselor. The Division Chair will work with the Division Chair for Student Support Services to adjust the schedule if needed. Guidance will inform the teacher, student, family, and chair of the outcome of the decision.
- After ten days (8-29 and beyond): A withdrawal from class will result in a WF on the transcript. A conference will occur with this process.
