Key Important Dates for Release of Information

As a means to prepare our families for the start of the school year, listed below are some tentative dates that we will release the following information:

Don't Forget that ID!

One of the most important ways that the YHS administrative and security teams ensure the safety of our students is through use of student IDs. All YHS students will be issued a new student ID for the 2024-2025 school year. All student's will have a new student ID prior to the end of the day on Friday, August 16th. It is an expectation that all students carry their physical student ID and present it to staff when they enter both academic buildings. Since many of our students travel between campuses, make use of their Off-Campus Privileges, and leave campus to participate in opportunities in the community like IVVC and Field Experience, it is imperative that campus security is able to quickly identify students as they enter and exit. We ask that students make it a habit to have their student ID readily available to show to staff



each day and as they travel between campuses. We appreciate our student's' help making YHS a safe place to be!

Please note that when a student is unable to present an ID when entering the building, the following steps are taken:

First occurrence: Staff will print the student a temporary ID to use for the day.

Second occurrence: staff will print the student a temporary ID to use for the day. Additionally, students will be charged \$1 to their student account.

Third and all future occurrences: Staff will print students a permanent ID and the student's account will be charged \$5.

NOTE: Any student that loses their ID can request a new ID to be printed for \$5.

The Purpose of Advisory

Noted director and producer Steven Spielberg wrote that, "the delicate balance of mentoring someone is not creating them in your own image, but giving them the opportunity to create themselves". As a major aspect of our schedule, all students are assigned to a twice weekly advisory (30 minutes) that focuses on engaging in and connecting to school culture and climate. Additional goals of our student advisory will be to connect

students to peers, to adults, and to Yorkville High School, provide them opportunities to build on their aspirations, and support the whole-child's health and well-being.

Each advisory block will have two adult mentors assigned to a group of approximately 26-28 students that will meet on A Days. Periodically, the advisory time will be allocated to deliver developmental guidance activities and to develop executive functioning.

The Purpose of FlexBlock

"Twenty years from now you will be more disappointed by the things that you didn't do than by the ones you did do. So throw off the bowlines. Sail away from the safe harbor. Catch the trade winds in your sails. Explore. Dream. Discover." – Mark Twain

A primary function of high school is to help our students discover their interests, passions, and purpose. Each full week, students will have two dedicated FlexBlocks (55 minutes). The FlexBlock serves as an opportunity for students to engage in activities, service based opportunities, pursue personal enrichment or



interest, or seek help or assistance. FlexBlock will operate as an on campus experience based on a system of earned privilege. Staff not engaged in weekly collaboration will be available to support targeted

interventions, provide academic assistance, and/or deliver case management support during the FlexBlock. Students will also have access to DEN Testing Centers, Open Labs (STEM, Art, Science, Food, Wellness Center), and Enrichment/Interest (for example, performance rehearsals) activities. As Twain stated above, our hope is that students use this time to explore, dream, and discover!

Lunch/Access - how it works!

All students will have a 25-minute lunch period opposite a 25-minute assigned ACCESS period.

Students will have Lunch and Access from 12:08 - 1:02 on A Days (after 5th Block) and B Days (after 6th Block). On C Days, when students will attend all of their scheduled classes, Lunch and Access from 11:55 - 12:49 (after 6th). It is important to understand that some students have lunch first, then Access while others will have Access first, then lunch. We will review lunch periods with students in the first couple of days.

This configuration means that during Lunch and Access, approximately one half of our student body is at lunch with the other half assigned to Access. Student attendance will be taken in Access each day and unexcused absences are subject to disciplinary consequences. Students needing academic support must obtain a pass from the teacher providing the academic support prior to attending Access. Students must report to Access for attendance and present the pass to their Access teacher prior to departing for academic support.

Students with off-campus privileges must leave campus or report to their assigned Lunch and Access class. Junior and Senior students who have approved off campus privileges may leave during Lunch and Access provided they properly check out of the building at either Door #1 or Door #19. Students are expected to leave their student ID with the adult supervising that door. Students who do not follow those procedures will receive a consequence and lose those privileges for a determined amount of time.

Students may only eat in designated lunch areas while on-campus. All students will be assigned a designated Lunch time and space to eat. Teachers' scheduled Access location/time will be posted on their individual Canvas pages. If a teacher's available Access time does not align with a student's, the teacher can work with the Dean's office to temporarily switch a student's Lunch and Access period to provide academic support.







No Outside Food Deliveries

In order to drastically reduce the amount of visitors and security risks to our campuses, Yorkville High School (YHS) Administration prohibits all outside food vendor deliveries for staff and students. The rationale for this plan is to enhance the security and safety of our building by limiting the number of outside visitors to the main entrance of both the YHS and YHSA campuses. We understand that this may create some inconvenience to students and staff, so we appreciate your support.

Yorkville CUSD School Meal Update

In 2024/25 Yorkville CUSD 115 will be participating in the USDA NSLP. This is a federally assisted meal program that provides nutritionally balanced meals with paid, free, and reduced-priced eligibility for students.

The NSLP uses specific Income Eligibility Guidelines to determine eligibility for free and reduced price meals for students. Parents/Guardians interested in completing an online application to receive meal

Attendance Matters

Parents as a reminder attendance and connectedness is a top indicator for a student's success during their high school experience. Your child's Dean of Students is here to support your child in both of these areas. To that end it is important that there is an open line of communication with the school when your student will not be in attendance. Please see the following parameters for excused vs. unexcused absences.



Excused vs. Unexcused Absences - An unexcused absence is defined as an absence from school for a reason other than those listed as an excused absence and/or an absence not authorized by school personnel. If the main office has not received a phone call from the student's parent/guardian prior to 9 a.m. on the day of the absence, the student will be considered unexcused. Please call the main office for YHS at 630-553-4380; or YHSA at 630-553-4385. YHS considers the following reasons as examples of an unexcused absence. This list is not exhaustive. It includes but is not limited to:

- 1. Oversleeping
- 2. Car trouble
- 3. Missing the bus
- 4. Giving rides to the airport
- 5. Babysitting
- 6. Shopping
- 7. Traffic

8. Vacations (family or otherwise) - The district believes that students should take family trips during scheduled school breaks and should be in school when school is in session. The district actively discourages the practice of students being taken out of school for family trips as vacations are recorded as unexcused absences.

Following Up after an Unexcused Absence or Tardy - YHS deans will send home information regarding unexcused absences from class as well as tardiness to class. In the event that your child is unexcused or excessively tardy to school or class, consequences may occur. We expect that students arrive at class and school on time. Any tardiness or late arrivals beyond 5 minutes will generate a referral to the dean's office. Parking Permit and Student ID Distribution

On August 8th and 9th, students or guardians who have purchased a parking permit can pick up their assigned permit in the Athletic Lobby. 

Schedule Change Process

Schedule Changes:

Course Selection and Scheduling

- First three days (8-15 thru 8-19): If a student is requesting to drop a class, they need to consult with their parent, current teacher and counselor to complete a "Course Withdrawal Request Form." The student will pick up a "Course Withdrawal Request Form" from their counselor. Students consult with their current teacher and case manager when applicable as they make decisions in regard to their current class. *Please note that class sizes are reflective of our mandate of the 70/30 ratio for our special education students and class options are limited due to seat occupancies at capacity for most sections. The Course Withdrawal Form is located in the Guidance Office.
- After three days (8-20 thru 8-28): The student and teacher need to work collaboratively with their respective Division Chair to complete the "Course Withdrawal Request Form" that a student will pick up from their counselor. The Division Chair will work with the Division Chair for Student Support Services to adjust the schedule if needed. Guidance will inform the teacher, student, family, and chair of the outcome of the decision.
- After ten days (8-29 and beyond): A withdrawal from class will result in a WF on the transcript. A conference will occur with this process.

24-25 Student Schedules

On Wednesday, August 7th - first semester schedules went live. We have been informed that some of our students may see on their schedule that they have one teacher for a year-long course during the first semester, and the student may have a different teacher for the same class and period for the second semester of the course. Our new Student Management System, Synergy, does not naturally link year-long courses by teacher and period. Our previous student management system, eSchool, did link year-long courses.

Despite not having the linking feature, the new system usually linked year-long courses as our prior system. In other instances, due to the availability of a student's second-semester electives preferences, the period or the teacher may have changed to accommodate those preferences. Finally, in some isolated circumstances, the system changed the period or teacher for no apparent reason.

With the start of the first semester only a week away, our dedicated Student Support Service teams will be working tirelessly to ensure that our students are in the appropriate courses and get our kids off to a great start. After the 10-day drop date (8/29), the counselors will rectify any nuances in your student's second-semester schedule. Thankfully, we will have 16 weeks to accomplish this work.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your student's schedule, please do not hesitate to reach out to their school counselor based on your student's grade level and last name.

Attention IVVC Students/Families

IVVC classes begin on Thursday, August 15th, 2024. Students will be allowed to drive themselves directly to and from IVVC as long as they have submitted parental transportation release (available on the parent portal) by 8/14/2024. Hey Seniors

As a reminder, all seniors must show proof of having had the meningitis vaccine for school attendance this year. Seniors must have at least 1 does of the meningitis vaccine after their 16th birthday. Additionally, as you were notified previously, proof of having the vaccine is required





in order for students to complete the registration process. If your student has already had this vaccine and you have not yet turned in proof, please contact YHS building nurses Meghan O'Connor

Hey Freshmen

As a reminder, all students entering 9th grade must have a medical physical exam on the Certificate of Child Health Exam form (Spanish)and updated immunizations on file by October 1, 2024, to avoid being excluded from school. (A sports physical does not meet this requirement). Appointment dates will not be accepted. Additionally, all 9th-grade

students must have proof of a dental exam on file by May 15, 2024. Here is the proof of dental examination form (spanish) that must be submitted.
