Over 1.7 million students took the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) last year. Emily, Julia, Everett, Benjamin & Tyler **ranked among the top three percent of more than 1.7 million students who entered the competition.**

Yorkville High School's Career and Technical Education: Empowering Students for Every Pathway

As I shared in prior posts, we firmly believe that "High school graduation is a Milestone, not a Capstone " in a student's educational experience. We understand that our students will pursue a variety of post-secondary opportunities. Some may aim for a two- or four-year college, others will explore vocational training through trade schools or apprenticeships, some may serve in the military, and others may enter the workforce directly. Our role is not to choose for them but to provide as many viable opportunities as possible, allowing them to explore their aspirations and find their path. This diverse range of options ensures students' unique ambitions are catered to.





One key avenue through which we achieve this is our **partnership with the Indian Valley Vocational Center (IVVC).** This dynamic program provides hands-on, work-based learning experiences that prepare our students for various careers by equipping them with practical skills, industry certifications, and realworld experiences. From automotive technology and health occupations to culinary arts and construction trades, **IVVC offers 19 different programs that connect students with meaningful career pathways.**

Growing Opportunities Through Vocational Education

The numbers tell a remarkable story of growth and success. In the 2024 school year, **220 Yorkville High School students enrolled in at least one course through IVVC, representing 11% of our total enrollment and 22% of our juniors and seniors.** These opportunities allow students to gain classroom knowledge and practical, industry-aligned skills. In 2024, 94.5% were successful in these industry-aligned courses, ranging from Welding to Fire Science to Law Enforcement to Computer Technology. This demonstrates the high student engagement and academic achievement level within our vocational/career-based programs, a testament to our students' hard work and dedication.

Moreover, the number of students earning dual credit through IVVC has grown significantly. In 2024, our IVVC students accumulated 448 college credit hours, an increase of 263 from just the prior year,

positioning them for significant savings on future tuition/certification costs. This initiative supports our broader effort to ease the financial burden on families while providing students with a valuable head start on their post-secondary education. These industry/career based courses, coupled with work-based learning, offer students both the academic foundation and practical experience to transition smoothly into the next stage of their lives, ensuring parents feel financially secure about their children's education.

Work-Based Learning: Industry Credentials and Career Development

A unique aspect of IVVC's offerings is the opportunity for students to earn Industry Credentials and participate in Career Development Experiences (CDEs). In 2024, **145 students earned 236 industry**recognized credentials, demonstrating proficiency in skills immediately applicable to the workforce. These certifications allow students to enter various industries directly upon graduation, equipped with the qualifications employers seek. Additionally, six students earned Career Development Experiences, such as internships or job shadowing, providing invaluable exposure to the working world and helping them make informed career decisions.

The cumulative impact of these experiences is clear. By the time they graduated, **81% of our seniors had** earned advanced placement, college credit, and many had also obtained industry certifications or completed work-based learning experiences. Combined with credits earned through other avenues, such as AP or Dual Credit offerings, our recent grads accumulated over \$3.1 in potential savings toward their post-secondary aspirations. These diverse pathways—whether through vocational training, AP coursework, or dual credit—equip our students with options that align with their unique ambitions.

Acknowledging Our Partners

We are thankful for the great work of our partners at IVVC. Their expertise, mentorship, and commitment to student success have been instrumental in building these programs into what they are today. 
